


First color will sew out the design shape in full.  
Using the map I give in image form, and  
using a disappearing ink pen, write the numbers  
in the spaces if you like for easier sewing



Lay the first fabric good face up over the number 1





**Place fabric 2 face down over fabric 1  
and sew your first seam ( next color)**

**Remove hoop**

**Trim to 1/4 inch seam**

**and Press fabric open**



Place fabric 3 over the placement of your number 3  
and sew the next color(seam)

Remove hoop and press open



**Some times I finger Press  
the fabric along the next sewing line  
Gives me a better idea  
where to place the next fabric**



Here I finger pressed the fabrics  
and drew a line with disappearing inkpen  
to help place my next fabric



**Trimming the seams**






**Continue till all numbers are covered**



**Besure you leave ample fabric  
to cover the areas required  
Sew, Remove hoop, trim, and press.  
and if you want  
finger press next seam and mark**




**Here is the stems done and  
next step finger pressed and marked  
Ready for the leaves now**



Now the base of the Rose Bush



**Now the final seam will be all around the block to give you a seam to cut a final 1/4 inch seam allowance**
